The cARTwheels grant program provides high quality stage performances and residency experiences to students across North Carolina.

- Teacher workshop to help teachers create entry ways for their students to the performance.
- Live performances: two 50-minute, high quality, age-appropriate performances that engage students' imaginations.
- Residency activities in schools and in community.

★ Arts in Education Residency Grant ★

Pre K–12 schools, school systems, nonprofit arts or community organizations or partnership teams consisting of at least one school and one arts group may apply for this funding.

- ★ Supports standards-based, long-term (10 days and longer) artist residencies.
- ★ Provide students with the opportunity to gain in-depth knowledge and skills in the arts.
- ★ Educators and artists collaborate to design a residency that meets the needs of the school.
- ★ Engages students in hands-on, participatory arts learning.

Educators and artists work together to build curricula, deliver instruction, and learn from each other.
